On January 1, 2022, the total population in Texas county jails decreased by 1,014 from the previous month. Statewide capacity increased by 72 due to Hidalgo adding variance beds. Jails are now collectively operating at 72% of capacity. As of January 1, 2022, there were (0) zero jails at 100% or more of capacity.

On January 1, 2022, zero (0) TDCJ Half-Way House inmates were housed in county facilities. In addition, local facilities were housing twenty-five (23) out-of-state inmates (New Mexico) in one (1) facility. The total number of contract inmates (county, federal, TDCJ and out-of-state) was 6,367.
