Custody level assignmentsshall not exceed the construction security level</p> <p>Reference Special Inspection from October 25, 2022, when they were placed into Non-Compliance for this deficiency of being overpopulated. During onsite inspection conducted on today it was discovered that they remain overpopulated and currently have 110 inmates at the facility. Deficiency still exists.</p>
2	273.2	(3)	<p>Each facility shall have and implement a written plan, approved by the Commission, for inmate medical, mental, and dental services. The plan shall:(3) provide procedures for efficient and prompt care for acute and emergency situations</p> <p>Reference Special Inspection on April 6, 2022, when it was discovered during a review of a complaint regarding the Coryell County Jail, it was determined that the jail did not follow their approved health services plan regarding efficient and prompt care. As of today, the jail has not yet submitted their plan of action regarding this matter and have several more days before the deadline to do so. Deficiency still exists.</p>
	273.2	(7)	<p>Each facility shall have and implement a written plan, approved by the Commission, for inmate medical, mental, and dental services. The plan shall:</p> <p>(7) provide procedures for the distribution of prescriptions in accordance with written instructions from a physician by an appropriate person designated by the sheriff/operator;</p> <p>Review of the Coryell County jail medical administration record sheets revealed that there were multiple occasions in which the jail staff failed to document the distribution and or refusal of prescribed medications.</p>
