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## NOTICE OF NON-COMPLIANCE

### LLANO COUNTY JAIL

August 25, 2025

Please reference the Inspection Requirements Review and Jail Inspection Report issued on August 25, 2025, detailing the specific issues that resulted in the issuance of this notice of non-compliance.

263.56	Emergency power equipment shall be tested at least once each week and the electric load transferred to the circuits at least monthly. <b>No monthly load test was conducted for the month of September 2024 and December 2024. Additionally, no weekly run test was conducted for the following weeks; September 1 - October 5, 2024, October 13 - November 2, 2024, November 10, 2024 - January 4, 2025 and July 6 - August 2, 2025.</b>	Upon receipt of this notice.
263.42	Each facility, after consultation with the local fire department or Texas Commission on Fire Protection, shall have and implement a written plan, approved by the Commission on Jail Standards, for fire prevention and a fire hazard inspection checklist which shall be evaluated no less than each calendar quarter. The facility shall be inspected annually by a local fire official who is certified by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection or who meets the alternative criteria provided in Government Code 419.909 and shall pass the inspection. <b>No fire prevention checklist was conducted for the 4th quarter of 2024 or the 1st quarter of 2025.</b>	Upon receipt of this notice.
271.1(a)(1)(A)(B)	inmates shall be classified and housed in the least restrictive housing available without jeopardizing staff, inmates or the public, utilizing risk factors which include any or all of the following: (A) current offense or conviction; (B) offense history;	Upon receipt of this notice.

**On one occasion the inmate was classified improperly utilizing the current offense and offense history.**

271.1(b)(3)

Custody Reassessment/Review. A custody reassessment shall be conducted within 30 - 90 days of the Initial Custody Assessment and immediately upon any disciplinary action and/or change in legal status which would affect classification. A documented classification review to determine the necessity for a complete reassessment shall be conducted every 30 - 90 days thereafter.

**3 of the 5 files reviewed exceeded the 30-90 days reclassification period by 3 days, 62 days and 33 days. Further, one file submitted indicated multiple overages of the reclassification period by 61 days, 92 days and 15 days.**

A documented observation of the inmate shall be conducted every 15 minutes, at a minimum. The observations should include an assessment of the security of the restraints and the circulation to the extremities.

**On one occasion staff exceeded the required 15 minute observation time by 28 minutes.**

Each facility shall have and implement a written plan, approved by the Commission, for inmate physical exercise and physical recreation. Documentation of physical exercise and physical recreation shall be maintained for Commission review. Each inmate shall be allowed one hour of supervised physical exercise or physical recreation at least three days per week.

**For the month of April 2025 only 4 days of physical exercise or physical recreation was provided.**
